## **DEUTSCHES REICHSVERBAND**

Welfare cards bearing the distinctive logo of the Non-profit-making Organisation (Reichsverband) were marketed to support German veterans and combatants of the army and the navy and bore the inscription Wohlfahrtskarte des Reichsverband zur Unterstützung Deutscher Veteranen E. V. und Kriegsteilnehmer des Heeres und der Marine.

The origin of the Reichsverband lay in the Franco-Prussian War, (19 July 1870 – 10 May 1871), a war in which a coalition of German states led by Prussia defeated France. The war marked the end of French hegemony in continental Europe and resulted in the creation of the German Empire (1871-1914).



With the declaration of WWI, the organisation was resuscitated. The logo, an Iron Cross with floral embellishment (sp. Convolvulaceae), is inscribed with the years 1870 / 1871 and 1914.

As with the German Red Cross (Deutsches Rotes Kreuz), this organisation also found willing patrons amongst **German Royalty** and **German military hierarchy.** Whether this co-operation was driven by patriotism / nationalism or a form of strategic marketing directed at stamping their authority on the politically unstable and competitive environment that existed within the country is unknown to me.
