The collection that follows is but a soupçon of that available to the dedicated collector. Though there are many fine works of art available, this reflects my principle interest in one, **Gottfried Mind.**

GOTTFRIED MIND (* Bern 1768 – † 1814) was a Swiss autistic savant who manifest an extraordinary talent for drawing. He was called the *Raphael of Cats* because of the excellence with which he painted those animals. However, this appellation greatly understates his talents; for instance, it is his pictures of peasant children that appear on the Pro Juventute cards.

For the most part, the artwork was rendered on small sheets in watercolour. As caricatures they have a certain careful elegance suggesting advanced powers of observation in the artist. They depict impoverished street children occupied in playground sports, bantering, quarrels, and sledge-parties. Their faces are merry and characterful; clothes raged but, in a sense, picturesque. Through them, one easily imagines hearing the hubbub of children at play.
